

CONVENTION PROGRAM. The program is arranged in specialty areas which separate the various areas of study in behavior analysis. The presentation formats within each of these specialty areas include:

Addresses. ABA invites distinguished individuals to give 20 or 50 minute presentations throughout the Convention. Invited Addresses are given by members of ABA and Guest Addresses are given by nommembers.

Business Meetings for Committees and Special Interest Groups are scheduled during the Convention. When so indicated, these meetings are open to all interested persons.

Group Conversation Hours are scheduled each afternoon and are open to all convention attendees.

Papers are 20 minute presentations of a project delivered by one person.

**Poster Sessions.** Information is posted and the author is available for 90-minutes to discuss the project. One prize for excellence is awarded by the poster session host of each specialty area presented when warranted.

**Pre-Convention Institutes** allow for more lengthy presentations than are possible during the Convention and are offered for Continuing Education Credit (see Workshops for further information).

Seminars provide the opportunity for practical training in the field of behavior analysis. A wide range of topics are presented and a seminar may require prerequisite skills. Many of the seminars emphasize techniques for behavior change and provide materials so that the participant may continue to use the techniques upon returning to their research or service site. Seminars are not offered for continuing education credit and records of participation in seminars are not maintained by ABA. The seminars are identified as introductory, intermediate, or advanced.

Symposia consist of several paper presentations on a related topic delivered by persons from different institutions.

Workshops. The Association for Behavior Analysis is approved by the American Psychological Association to sponsor continuing education programs in psychology. One of the primary objectives of ABA is to provide educational opportunities for members and other professionals to review recent research, discuss current theoretical issues, and learn new methods of the application of behavior analysis to societal problems. While ABA does not require participation in the continuing education program for Association membership, ABA strongly recommends involvement in the program. The Continuing Education Program does not provide the necessary educational foundation for entry into the discipline of psychology, nor is the program intended to prepare individuals to alter the direction of a professional career. The Continuing Education Program is designed to meet the academic needs of self-improvement and to provide continuing academic training as required by many licensing associations and specialty boards. The Continuing Education Program has been arranged to permit convention participants to enroll in a number of workshops which have been identified by the area of study and continuing education credits. The following statement will accompany workshops:

"The Association for Behavior Analysis is approved by the American Psychological Association to sponsor continuing education in pscyhology. This program is offered for hours of continuing education credit." (One contact hour equals one credit hour.)

The record of these continuing education credits, which are not equivalent to university credit hours, will be recorded by ABA and the American Psychological Association Continuing Education Credit Registry. Participants will be provided documentation of the earned credits by the Registry Service, and a record of continuing education will be maintained by ABA.

#### ABA CERTIFICATION EXAMINATION

What Is It? ABA offers a general exam as the first stage of certification as a Behavior Analyst. The purpose of the general exam is to assess the applicant's verbal competency with respect to basic behavioral principles and to establish the applicant's eligibility for his/her practicing or specialty competency in behavior analysis (stage two of the ABA certification). The form of the exam is multiple choice with some essays including analysis of "behavioral vignettes". The second stage of certification involves a more extensive assessment and monitoring of performance in an area of specialization (e.g. behavioral clinical, behavior analysis in education).

Who Can Take It? Eligibility criteria for taking the general exam are: (1) working on minimal degree required in one's area of professional

training in the human services; and (2) membership in ABA.

Why Certify? Certification allows the professional some formal indicator of his/her competence as a practicing behavior analyst. In addition, current professional licensing or certification procedures in some disciplines, particularly psychology, are limited to doctoral level practitioners. Yet within the field of behavior analysis there are now professional Masters level practitioners who must be able to document their professional competency. And finally, some individuals may want certification for their own professional growth.

How Can I Prepare for the General Exam? A list of suggested readings and study guides may be obtained from Linda Parrott, Department of Psychology, St. Mary's University, Halifax, Nova Scotia, Canada B3H 3H3. How Do I Register? Pre-registration is encouraged. To pre-register, submit fees along with the registration form for the Convention or the Pre-convention Institute. On site registration may be accomplished at the Pre-Convention Institute registration desk or the Convention registration desk during scheduled hours. The fee is \$30.00 per applicant for pre-registrants, \$35.00 for on-site registrants.

When Will I Learn About My Test Results? The ABA Certification Board

When Will I Learn About My Test Results? The ABA Certification Board will score the exams and notify applicants of their performance within 8 weeks of taking the test. Applicants will be informed of those areas in which their performances were deficient. The exam may be retaken as often as necessary to achieve proficient performance. Exam scores will not be released to persons other than the Certification or Specialty Board Members without the applicant's written permission.
